# CHAPTER 63:53

# **EXPORTATION OF FRUIT ACT**

1950 Ed. Ch. 32. No. 6.	An Act relating to the exportation of fruit.
$\frac{1}{23 \text{ of } 1931.}$	
Commencement.	[1st December 1931]
Short title.	<b>1.</b> This Act may be cited as the Exportation of Fruit Act.
Interpretation.	2. In this Act—
	"fruit" means any fresh fruit, nut, or vegetable to which this Act shall be made to apply by Order of the Minister;
	"fruit inspector" means any person appointed under section 4 to exercise the powers of inspection of fruit under this Act;
	"packing house" means the packing house or houses as specified in the Regulations;
	the word "export" shall be applicable only to fruit shipped for marketing outside of Trinidad and Tobago.
Packing and shipping.	<b>3.</b> All fruit intended for export shall be packed and shipped in accordance with this Act and the Regulations.
Inspectors.	<b>4.</b> The Minister may appoint fit and proper persons to be fruit inspectors, one of whom shall be designated as the Chief Fruit Inspector.
Inspection.	<b>5.</b> The person in charge of a packing house shall give written notice to the Chief Fruit Inspector of the time during which it is proposed to pack fruit, and no fruit shall be wrapped or packed until it has been inspected and approved by a fruit inspector. The examination shall include inspection of the containers and such supervision as is possible of the packing of such fruit.
Duty of inspector.	<b>6.</b> It shall be the duty of every fruit inspector to satisfy himself that fruit intended for export conforms to the specifications set out in the Regulations.

7. On being satisfied that the requirements of section 3 have Stamping of backages and been complied with, the fruit inspector shall mark each package issue of certificate. of fruit intended for export with a stamp showing that the fruit in such package has been inspected and passed as fit for export by a fruit inspector and at the same time shall issue a certificate in the form in the Schedule. The certificate shall be conclusive evidence Schedule. that the requirements of this Act and the Regulations have been complied with.

8. No person shall export or attempt to export fruit unless all Unauthorised export. the requirements of this Act and the Regulations have been complied with, and no person shall wilfully tamper with any package after the same has been certified as fit for export.

9. The Comptroller of Customs and Excise shall refuse to Power of permit the exportation of fruit not certified by a fruit inspector as fit for export, and may also exercise the like power whenever he has reasonable cause to suspect that any certified package of fruit has been tampered with after certification by a fruit inspector.

**10.** (1) The Minister may make Regulations with regard to Regulations. the exportation of fruit and generally for carrying into effect the provisions and purposes of this Act, including the payment of fees.

(2) Regulations made under this section shall be subject to affirmative resolution of Parliament.

11. Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this Penalties. Act or of the Regulations is liable, on summary conviction, to a fine of one thousand dollars.

7. Crates shall be so constructed as to provide panel ends and centre piece. The inside dimensions shall be twelve inches by twelve inches by twenty-four inches. The fruit shall be so packed that the cover will bulge at the middle; provided that the overall height of the box after packing shall not exceed fourteen and a half inches. A flat pack may be used to meet the requirements of any special trade or special order to the satisfaction of the Chief Fruit Inspector. The cover shall be fastened over the centre by a metal strap not less than eighteen inches in length and an additional strap or wire fastened completely around the base at each end for all crates intended for export outside the West Indies. To meet the requirements of any particular trade or of any special demand the Chief Fruit Inspector may permit the use of packages other than those of standard construction and dimensions.

Stencilling. 8. The words "Trinidad and Tobago Co-operative Citrus Growers' Association" shall be stencilled in bold letters on both sides of the container used for shipment of all fruit included in grades (i) to (v) specified in regulation 6. Special containers, authorised by the Chief Fruit Inspector, and so marked as to indicate that the fruit is of Trinidad origin may be used to meet the requirements of any special demand.

**9.** On standard crates an attractive label representing the brand shall be pasted on one end panel. The number of fruit or the size of the fruit in the box shall be stamped on the top left-hand corner and the grade (for example: Choice) on the right-hand corner.

#### PACKING

**10.** Except in the case of grade (vii) specified in regulation 6, each fruit shall be tightly wrapped in good paper, which bears a design representing the brand of the fruit; all such designs shall face the outside of the boxes.

**11.** Exports of grade (vii) specified in regulation 6 shall be Grade (vii). allowed only for filling definite orders and on permits previously obtained from the Chief Fruit Inspector who should satisfy himself as to the ultimate destination of the fruit prior to the issue of a permit.

#### **EXPORTATION OF FRUIT** (LIMES) REGULATIONS

made under section 10

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Exportation of Fruit Citation. (Limes) Regulations.

2. All limes intended for export shall be packed at a packing Licensed packing houses. house in respect of which a licence has been issued by the Chief Fruit Inspector. No such licence shall be issued in respect of any premises situated at a distance of more than one mile from Port-of-Spain in Trinidad or Scarborough in Tobago.

3. The owner, occupier or person in charge of any licensed Care of packing house shall keep such premises in a clean and sanitary condition to the satisfaction of the Chief Fruit Inspector.

4. All limes intended for export shall be of the degree of Condition. maturity required by the trade, and shall be undamaged and free of any dirt, decay, disease, bruising, creasing, dryness, scars and cuts.

5. Limes intended for export shall be graded according to Grades. the following grades:

(1) *Large*—which includes all limes which will not pass through a grade ring of one and seven-eighths inches diameter.

(2) *Medium*—which includes all limes which will pass through a ring of one and seven-eighths inches diameter but not through a ring of one and five-eighths inches in diameter.

(3) Small-which includes all limes which will pass through a ring of one and five-eighths inches in diameter.

6. Each lime shall be tightly wrapped in wrapping paper Wrapping. approved by the Fruit Inspector, but limes intended for export to the United States of America may be wrapped in straw paper.

7. All the limes packed in any one container shall be of Packing. uniform size and packed in a uniform pattern.
