Creamery Novelties which is located at eTeck's Industrial Park, Diamond Vale, is focused on producing high quality ice-cream; ice-cream lollies; ice-cream; waffle, sugar and wafer cones. These operations will earn TT\$3 million on average in exports or foreign exchange earnings annually.
