GOVERNMENT FOCUSED ON REVITALIZING SOUTH TRINIDAD

<u>21st September, 2018: -</u> "San Fernando now has some of the best retail spaces in the country," says the Minister of Trade and Industry Senator the Honourable Paula Gopee-Scoon. "...Our retail centre here at South Park represents a long term commitment to bringing value to our customers and communities across south Trinidad. This facility," he said, "represents an amalgamation of our three most lucrative brands and a great network of international partnerships with some of the most progressive names in the retail sector."

Mr Clive Fletcher Managing Director at Unicomer (Trinidad) Limited stated that "This is truly a turning point for us all... and I look forward to us building stronger bonds as we collectively commit to ensuring a bright future for us all here in Trinidad and Tobago." Unicomer employs 1000 persons in Trinidad and Tobago. The new South Park location reflects an investment of TT\$25M with sustained employment for 50 persons at the 31,500 square feet facility.
