Good morning and Happy International Women's Day!

I am delighted to be here to celebrate International Women's Day 2024 at the Ministry of Trade and Industry's SheTrades Business Seminar under the United Nation's theme "Count her In: Invest in Women. Accelerate Progress".

This year's theme captures the essence of the work we at the Ministry of Trade and Industry and exporTT have been pursuing under the Trinidad and Tobago SheTrades Hub. The main objective of SheTrades is to connect women entrepreneurs to international markets. With the establishment of our National Hub in October 2020, the first of its kind in the Caribbean, we have been working assiduously to count you, the women of Trinidad and Tobago in, as valuable players in the business and trading community.

We understand that for any country to progress there must be full participation of women in the labour force. The World Economic Forum estimates that advancing women's employment could add US\$ 12 trillion to global GDP and has the potential to boost economic output in countries as much as 35%.

Achievements of the Trinidad and Tobago SheTrades Hub

Today we have over 700 local women-owned businesses registered and subscribed to the Trinidad and Tobago SheTrades Hub.

Through our various programmes and initiatives under the SheTrades Hub, we have been investing in you to accelerate your progress. In fact, since the launch of the initiative:

- over 160 women across Trinidad and Tobago were trained in the areas of Identifying and Assessing Export Markets; Developing Export Plans, Export Readiness and Following up on Export Leads, in order to further strengthen their business skills;
- 24 female entrepreneurs received funding to participate and showcase their products at international and regional trade shows in Madrid, St. Lucia and Barbados. exporTT, our national export promotion agency is working with these women to follow-up on leads generated; and
- 66 women-owned businesses benefitted from funding to participate at local trade shows and markets, including the Export Centers Company Limited Craft Market and the Trinidad and Tobago Manufacturers' Association, Trade and Investment Convention. Through these initiatives, these women-owned businesses were able to boost their visibility, increase sales and expand business connections.

We will be all pleased to know that nine (9) Trinidad and Tobago women-led businesses representing the Food and Beverage, Beauty Cosmetics, Handicraft, Apparel and Health Services sectors, through their registration on the SheTrades Hub were selected to participate at this year's SheTrades Summit in Abu Dhabi. These women had the opportunity to attend two days of panel discussions, masterclasses and specific networking sessions with other female business owners from around the world.

These are just some of the successes to date, later in the Programme, you will hear personal testimonials from some of the women.
